Important notes from Council meeting December 29th

In late December, Council received a request from Fredericton CRC council to support an overture to Classis Eastern Canada regarding the Synod 2022 decision and the Human Sexuality Report. Council met to discuss this overture, where the majority of Calvary council voted in favour of supporting the overture. The overture, which will be presented at Classis 2023 in March, asks that a Classis of the CRCNA, in response to local needs and circumstances, may declare that Article 65, Item 2 of the Acts of Synod 2022 (p.922) be considered inoperative, thereby allowing office bearers from local congregations who disagree with the decision to continue serving and ministering within their local contexts without being subject to discipline.

Council further discussed a request from Ryan Farrell, the new chaplain at Ottawa Campus Chaplaincy, to have Calvary C.R.C. as his calling church. Council voted in favour of holding these credentials and now this request needs approval from the congregation. This will take place Today, after the service.
