September Council Meeting Summary

1. The church survey was reviewed and discussed. Your responses to the survey were very helpful. It is clear that some people have not returned to church following the pandemic closure for a variety of reasons. We are thankful that a number continue to faithfully watch our services on-line and that many have returned to worship in person. Please see below a note from Council regarding questions related to the Human Sexuality Report decision from Synod.

2. The following members will be attending the Classis Meeting on October 20-21 at Community CRC, Dixon's Corners. Elders: Cathy V., Kristy McW.; Deacons - Cora S., Yolandi F.. Pastor Harold will also attend as an observer. Members are welcome to also attend any portion of the meetings. Please note that on Friday, October 20th at 1:00 pm, there will be a Delegate conversation re Synod 2023 decisions concerning HSR. This time will be facilitated by Syd Hielema, Regional Pastor, Cl Hamilton and Consultant to CRCNA Connections Project. 4. A report was received from the Pastor Search Team. They are continuing to look for a pastor who will be a good fit for Calvary.

Council Report on the Church Survey and Human Sexuality Report

Thank you, to everyone (112) who shared their observations and feelings with Council in our recent survey. It has been quite clear that our congregation and our denomination have been wrestling with the report on Human Sexuality. It is also clear that we have divergent views contributing to a level of angst. We are saddened that some members are continuing to resign their membership in the C.R.C.. We also, each of us, know we are the undeserving recipients of God's grace, redeemed, but not perfect and we humbly acknowledge this important truth. Our leaders at Calvary accept that we are conflicted but not in conflict, we are troubled but not in trouble. Your Council wants to remind you that we are a "Reformed and Reforming" church and that we have not yet reached the conclusion of this story. We recognize the conversation will likely continue for a very long time. As a congregation, we need to remember how much love we share within this church family. We trust you will join the Council in our commitment to continue the dialogue, to humbly proceed with love and respect for one another, and to renounce any form of judgment. Each individual is precious to our fellowship and each voice is important. We want to continue to work together as a congregation and to wait patiently upon the Lord. God is good.

It was agreed that elders will be sensitive to the concerns raised by members within their ward and that they would welcome calls or requests for visits to discuss issues further. Council recognizes the need for a listening ear and for ongoing dialogue.

TODAY - Race Relations

Our office was born out the struggles of a local church in Chicago. African American parents from Lawndale C.R.C. who wanted to enroll their children in a nearby "whites only" Christian school made a brave choice: they would struggle together against the forces of segregation and exclusion, for the sake of their children. They brought their concerns to Synod, the C.R.C.'s decision-making body, and our predecessor, the Synodical Committee on Racial Reconciliation, was one of the results. Later, in Canada, several people from diverse racial, ethnic, and faith backgrounds who were joining Christian Reformed churches were seeking authentic ways to remove perceived barriers to fully belonging to the C.R.C.. They started out meeting in living rooms and sharing their stories and faith journeys. Eventually they formally organized themselves into a classical committee and the Canadian racial reconciliation curriculum "Widening the Circle" was created.
