October 01 - Race Relations

Our office was born out the struggles of a local church in Chicago. African American parents from Lawndale C.R.C. who wanted to enroll their children in a nearby "whites only" Christian school made a brave choice: they would struggle together against the forces of segregation and exclusion, for the sake of their children. They brought their concerns to Synod, the C.R.C.'s decision-making body, and our predecessor, the Synodical Committee on Racial Reconciliation, was one of the results. Later, in Canada, several people from diverse racial, ethnic, and faith backgrounds who were joining Christian Reformed churches were seeking authentic ways to remove perceived barriers to fully belonging to the C.R.C.. They started out meeting in living rooms and sharing their stories and faith journeys. Eventually they formally organized themselves into a classical committee and the Canadian racial reconciliation curriculum "Widening the Circle" was created. Safe Church Prayer:

Triune God - hear our prayer.

God, you are the Creator and Sustainer of all. You created a galaxy so vast we only see it in part. You created atoms and molecules so minuscule we only see them with science. You smelled the flowers before creating them to bloom, and tasted the bounty of the crops before they emerged from the soil. You playfully gave animals big and small, spotted and striped, walking, flying and swimming. You God created and continue to create beauty and complexity that leaves us in awe and wonder - for this we give you thanks and praise.

Creator God, while we see the beauty of your creation we also see countless ways that sin has destroyed that which you called "good." We see it in the physical creation. We see it in war-torn countries. We see it in the economic disparity and unequal distribution of resources. We see it in our own country, in our churches, our

families, and within ourselves. We lament the brokenness and the pain.

Today we pray for our churches. You call the church to bring forth your kingdom here on earth, to be salt and light, places where the Gospel is proclaimed and your people worship in Spirit and truth. We acknowledge the sin within our own churches. They are not immune from Satan's attacks and temptations and we grieve the many ways the church has been an agent of sin, rather than an agent of hope and restoration. We pray that our own church would be bold in assessing our risk for abuse. Abuse has no place within the walls of your church, and we commit to taking these first steps to prevent it. As we assess our risk, God would you be gentle with us where our hearts are tender? And would you convict us and open our eyes where they need to be opened? Teach us your ways.

As you teach us your ways and shed light on the darkness among us, we pray that we would have the strength and the courage to act. God, no step is too small to be the first step towards abuse prevention. Holy Spirit, move in our hearts as we as Your church put systems in place to protect the vulnerable. Give wisdom to those who craft policies - that they would not place ease over safety and comfort over protection. Teach us Lord, to give.

As leaders are screened and trained may they take seriously their call to love You and to love their siblings in Christ in this very tangible way. Protect hearts within the church that have experienced abuse and are triggered by trainings. Give leaders discernment and wisdom to make good and just decisions. Help us as a congregation to always be mindful of those who suffer. Teach us to weep.
